Prof. Eric Raymond is a Medical Doctor board certified in medical oncology and has a PhD in cellular and molecular biology. His first appointment was Clinical Director at the Pierre et Marie Curie University Hospital (Paris 6, France), followed by a post-doctoral fellowship at the CTRC/IDD (University of Texas, USA). Subsequently, he undertook clinical and translational research in early drug development at the Gustave Roussy (France) before being appointed Professor of Oncology at the University of Paris VII and Chair of Medical Oncology at Bichat-Beaujon University Hospitals (France). In 2014, he was appointed Head of Medical Oncology at the University of Lausanne (CHUV, Switzerland), before moving to the Paris Saint-Joseph Hospital in 2016 as Head of Medical Oncology and Deputy Director for Specialized medicine and Emergency.

Prof. Raymond has focused on translational research including early clinical trials using therapeutics with novel mechanisms of action, bridging preclinical and translational data with clinical applications to accelerate novel drug positioning. This includes developing tumour tissue-based biomarkers, liquid biopsies, and in-patient molecular imaging.

Prof. Raymond has facilitated the registration of several drugs including oxaliplatin, sunitinib, temsirolimus, and everolimus. He has served on several scientific boards, has published numerous peer-reviewed articles and has been on the editorial boards of various high-impact factor journals.
